SUMMIT PRESCHOOL

Summit School is one of the few Phoenix preschools accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). Our program is research-based, developmentally appropriate, and taught by educated and experienced teachers.

Summit's child-centered preschool program is responsive to the skills, needs, and interests to each specific child in the classroom.

Our teachers intentionally set up the environment, develop learning activities, and immerse the students in units of studies that are based on their observations of their students. Our program fosters growth in all developmental areas including social-emotional, physical, language, cognitive, literacy, math, science, and social studies. Preschool students also participate in Spanish, music, library, and art classes taught by Summit Specialist teachers.

Our preschool teachers average fifteen years of experience, with degrees and certifications in the early childhood field.

Many of them present at local and national conferences, serve on NAEYC teams, and have mentored and coached other teachers.

Early childhood is a time for students to gain confidence in their abilities, to develop flexible approaches to learning, and to see the connections between all areas of their world. Our students enter kindergarten with confidence in their ability to reason, problem-solve, understand and contribute valuable ideas.

SUMMIT ELEMENTARY

Summit's elementary school program nurtures a community of students who show intellectual curiosity and social-emotional growth as they pursue their "personal best." Each child brings distinct gifts and talents, and Summit challenges each of them to achieve their full potential.

Small class sizes allow our teachers to truly know their students.

Our teachers fully support each individual child because they understand each student's academic needs, personality, learning styles, and their social-emotional areas of growth. Every child is known and valued and with that, learning possibilities are endless.

Our elementary curriculum blends traditional and innovative practices, creating a balance of academic and authentic experiences that challenge students' thinking.

Engaging students in complex real-life challenges through project based learning gives them ownership of their learning and helps them understand and use their strengths.

Summit's expert teachers empower and support students. Three-quarters of Summit's elementary faculty have been with the school for more than ten years. All are passionate, well-educated, and committed to student learning. Math and Literacy Specialists supplement classroom instruction to challenge students to be their personal best in mathematics and reading.

Students are encouraged to widely participate in all subject areas including specialist-taught classes in Spanish, science, music, art/architectural design, computer science, library studies, and physical education.

We embrace **"WE"** over **"ME"** in the Summit community. Our Character and Respect Education Program (CARE) helps cultivate kindness and cooperation and provides a safe, responsible, and respectful environment for all.

SUMMIT MIDDLE SCHOOL

Summit Middle School equips students for high school and for navigating adolescence through a rigorous STEAM-based curriculum that develops both their intellect and character. Students master content in STEAM subjects, while developing 21st century skills like creativity, critical thinking, collaboration and communication in applying them to real-world situations.

Our Middle School environment stimulates intellectual curiosity, independent thinking and creative problem solving.

Students develop social and emotional skills to become secure, well-adjusted young people, prepared to make good life choices. Nurturing relationships with caring teachers and peers create a culture of safety and respect to support student growth.

Middle Schoolers learn through rich and varied programs, including elective classes.

Small class sizes allow experienced faculty members to know each student's potential and challenges. Close partnerships between teachers and parents help students achieve common goals and prepare them for success in high school and life.

Along with Summit's school-wide Character and Respect Education (CARE) program, Middle School students are equipped with skills and strategies from THINK6, our school's conflict resolution program.

Summit eighth graders participate in ROPES (Rite of Passage Experience) that challenges them to complete a project that stretches their comfort zone or explores a possible career path. Students find a community mentor, conduct research, and deliver a public presentation on the experience. Past ROPES projects include symphony conducting, firefighting, guitar building, and veterinary medicine.

Middle Schoolers also complete community service hours, helping them to gain insights into the needs of others and to see how they can benefit the world around them. Summit's last graduating class of 29 students completed more than 770 hours of service to the community.
